What exactly IS International Collaboration?

- <u>Peer-to-peer</u> (faculty-to-faculty; student-to-student; instructor-to instructor; scientist-to-scientist; and the list goes on and on...)
- <u>Technology enabled communication</u> (Zoom, email, WhatsApp, Skype) that is either in real time (synchronous) or not in real time (asynchronous)
- Facilitated (purposeful or structured) experiential learning, writing, or developing
- Enhanced cultural awareness as people work together, learn together, share life stories together, and understand each other

What makes it work?

- Ability to suspend cultural judgement and bias by letting go of stereotypes we may have developed through films, media, and popular tabloids
- Project or purpose (course project; grant writing; journal writing; research study) that has structure, goals, and deadlines
- Commitment to expend time and effort to schedule regular meeting times with goals for those meetings set
- Sharing ideas to develop documents and engage in common work
- Examples? Briefly state a project that might come to mind in the Chat (e.g., grant writing or scientific research project) Be sure to check to see if someone has a similar idea to yours! That may be a future collaboration!!!

Possible Barriers

- Language
- Cultural faux pas
- Time Zones
- Lack of clarity of goals and roles

Strategies to enhance international collaboration among professional colleagues

- Identify the project or task to accomplish
- Choose team members
- Establish areas of expertise for each team member
- Learn about the other culture to avoid unintentional faux pas
- Set specific meeting times/days of the week and maintain schedule
- Set schedule for tasks to accomplish with a means of sharing work between meetings (e.g., Google Drive; WhatsApp, etc.)

Strategies for Engaging Students in International Collaboration

- Spend time on cultural mapping and cross-cultural communication
- Establish a specific project with goals and roles for each team member
- Choose technology carefully
- Use both asynchronous and synchronous meetings (when possible)
- Communication, communication, communication...
